CH Legal Moment Denis Burns - Are child or spousal support payments tax deductible?

Announcer:	And now the Cohen Highley Legal Moment on 980CFPL
Announcer:	I'm here with Denis Burns from Cohen Highley Lawyers. Are child or spousal support payments tax deductible?
Denis Burns:	Child support payments are not deductible for the payor nor taxable to the recipient.
Announcer:	And spousal support?
Denis Burns:	Periodic spousal support (which is usually paid monthly) paid according to the terms of either a written Separation Agreement or a Court Order are taxable to the recipient and deductible by the payor. However, a lump sum of spousal support (support which is prepaid) is not included in the income of the support recipient nor is it deductible by the support payor.
Announcer:	How is child support decided?
Denis Burns:	There are child support guidelines which provide for a basic level of support which is based on the payor's income, and a second level to cover special or extraordinary expenses such as child care, extraordinary education and extra-curricular activity costs, health expenses and post-secondary education costs.
Announcer:	And how is spousal support decided?
Denis Burns:	Spousal support is much more complicated, but there are spousal support advisory guidelines that give assistance.
