Receptionist:	Cohen Highley.
Announcer:	And now, the Cohen Highley Legal Moment on FM 96. I'm here with Brian Phillips, a partner at Cohen Highley Lawyers. Brian, you mentioned that there's a real issue in London that landlords and potential landlords need to be aware of.
Brian Phillips:	Yes that's right. As of March last year a new By-law requires landlords to have a license for many types of rental properties. The license application costs \$25.00 but requires <i>extensive</i> information. If the City is not satisfied with that information, a license will not be issued.
Announcer:	What if I'm renting and do not have a license?
Brian Phillips:	Well, the By-law allows for fines for up to \$25,000 as an individual, and more if you're a corporate landlord.
Announcer:	Hmm, not good.
Brian Phillips:	It can get worse. If you currently have tenants and the City won't give you a license, you'd have to evict the tenants to keep the City from prosecuting you – which isn't easy, and in some cases it might not even be possible. You'd be stuck between a rock and a hard place.
Announcer:	So it's important to get that rental license?
Brian Phillips:	Absolutely. Now – there is a pending application before the courts to have the By-law quashed, but we are still awaiting that decision.
